Voluntary Sector Investment Programme: Innovation Excellence and Strategic Development Fund 2012-13

Applications are invited to the 2012-13 Innovation, Excellence and Strategic Development Fund that supports the voluntary sector in developing innovation across health and social care.

In the last round (2011-12), 57 projects benefited from funding under the scheme, at a total cost of just under £3.5 million for the year. These projects – from cancer services to mental health projects for young adults – are now benefiting patients across the country.

The fund comes as part of the overall Voluntary Sector Investment programme, which totalled over £18million for the year and was set up to improve links between the Department and third sector health and social care organisations across England.

BBC Children in Need - Grants Programme Deadline 15th October 2011

The BBC Children in Need Grants programme is aimed at organisations working with disadvantaged children and young people under the age of eighteen. The organisation and project must be based in the UK and must be from a charity or a not for profit organisation.

Small grants are for £10,000 or less a year per year for up to three years.

Main grants are for over £10,000 per year for up to three years.

The decisions for the October deadline will be announced in mid February.

Mrs Smith and Mount Trust Grant - Deadline: 30th September 2011

The Mrs Smith and Mount Trust Grant funds organisations in Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire, Herefordshire, Essex, Kent, Surrey and London that do work in the following areas:

- 1) Mental Health
- 2) Learning Difficulties
- 3) Homelessness
- 4) Health in the Community

Applications should be done using the online applications and the trust gives grants to projects mostly. Applications should include recent signed accounts, a budget for the project for the current financial year and if applying for a salary, a job description.

The Trustees do not consider applications from charities with an income of over £1 million and unrestricted reserves to the value of more than six months of the charities annual expenditure.

Repair Grants for Places of Worship (England) Deadline: 30th September 2011 (Grade II listed buildings)

This grant is for financial help for urgent high-level repairs for listed places of worship, repairs that should be needed in the immediate future, not for more than two years and be focused on keeping the fabric structurally safe and weathertight.

Funds are normally targeted at single repairs costing less than £250,000.

The buildings should be used for public worship for at least six days a year and visitor access should be available for at least forty days a year and be regularly advertised.

Macmillan - Helping You Help Others Grants

Deadline: 28th October 2011

The Macmillan Cancer Support group was set up to support those who have cancer and are caring for those who have Cancer, although the Macmillan group, does give grants to individuals who have cancer it also gives grants to support groups to do with cancer.

It has three of these group grants:

- 1) Start up grant- for help in starting up your cancer support group – this is assessed monthly.
- 2) Developing grants – for established groups that have been working in their community for a year or more and can apply for up to £3000 to develop a groups activities and resources, this has a recent deadline of 28th October though it is also assessed two other times a year.
- 3) Training and conference grants- these are also assessed monthly.

Bids should seek to develop new, innovative approaches to health and care, actively share excellent practice or improve integrated care and greater efficiency.

Last year awards ranged from £14,000 to £173,356.
